

# Fall Protection and Fall Hazard Safety

Falls are a **significant source of injury and death** within both General Industry and Construction.

Falls are a hazard **found in many work settings**. A fall can occur during walking, climbing stairs or a ladder to change a light fixture, or as a result of a complex series of events affecting an ironworker 80 feet above the ground!

Based on 2018/2019 published data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics, **282,860 private industry and state and local government workers missed one or more days of work due to injuries from falls** on the same level or to lower levels, and 880 workers died from such falls.

Fall injuries create a considerable financial burden: Workers' compensation and medical costs associated with occupational fall incidents have been estimated at \$70 billion annually in the United Sates alone. (NIOSH/CDC)
